New Security Technology Coming to CCIA

There's something new at Corpus Christi International Airport – and it's obvious to travelers who are deplaning from their flights. A local company, Horton Automatics, has installed a new security exit lane system that uses infrared technology to prevent the flow of pedestrian traffic in the wrong direction. The exit lane is the area in the concourse that funnels deplaning traffic out to the front of the terminal.

The exit lane at CCIA has traditionally been manned by TSA officers who stood guard and made sure that no one tried to bypass security and get to the secured side of the airport without proper vetting. This new technology can detect movement in the wrong direction and will alarm, shut doors and lock them down if this occurs.

Safety and security remains a top priority at CCIA. This new exit lane system offers another layer of defense against a variety of potential threats.

Horton Automatics is a locally based company that actually invented the sliding glass door. This new secure exit lane technology will likely begin showing up in other airports across the nation.
